Delaware River and Bay Authority Conducting Art and Photography Contest *Agency Celebrates Golden Anniversary*

(*New Castle, DE*) The Delaware River and Bay Authority continues to accept public entries for the agency's art and photography contest commemorating its 50th Anniversary until September 3, 2012. Individuals are encouraged to photograph, draw or paint one of the agency's facility locations for a chance to win \$500. The contest was announced in late June.

"We wanted to do something fun and interactive with our customers and neighbors to celebrate our anniversary," said Frank Minor, Deputy Executive Director of the Authority. "There's still time to submit your photo or art creation. So, whichever site and artistic medium you chose, whether on paper or through a camera lens, get creative and have fun!"

The contest is open to the public and divided into four categories: Children (4-9); Students (10-13); High School (14-17); and Adults (18 and older).

Two independent judges, one from Delaware and one from New Jersey, will judge the submissions. One winner from each category will receive a prize of \$50, and their artwork will hang on display in the DRBA for one year. The overall grand prize winner will be awarded \$500, and their work will also be showcased in the DRBA lobby. Winners will be announced on the agency's anniversary day, September 20, 2012.

All submitted works become property of the Delaware River and Bay Authority. Contestants should submit their art to the following address:

The Authority plans to display the art submissions within a public space at the main administrative complex in New Castle, Delaware. The United States Congress granted its consent for Delaware and New Jersey to form the bi-state agency on September 20, 1962.

About the Delaware River and Bay Authority

The Delaware River and Bay Authority, a bi-state governmental agency created by Compact in 1962, owns and operates the Delaware Memorial Bridge, the Cape May- Lewes Ferry, the Three Forts Ferry Crossing and the Salem Business Centre in Carney's Point Twp., NJ. The Authority also manages corporate and aviation properties through its economic development powers - two airports in New Jersey (Millville Airport and Cape May Airport) and three in Delaware (New Castle Airport, Civil Air Terminal and Delaware Airpark). All agency operating revenues are generated through the bridge, ferry and airport facilities.
