Delaware River and Bay Authority Releases 2022 Committee and Board Meeting Schedule

To adhere to CDC recommendations to avoid large gatherings and observe social distancing during the COVID-19 pandemic, DRBA Committee and Board meetings will continue to be held virtually until further notice. These meetings begin at 10:00 a.m. and the electronic link will be available at www.drba.net approximately one week prior to the meeting date.

The DRBA plans to resume in-person Committee and Board meetings when conditions permit and it is safe to do so. Generally, these in-person meetings take place in the James Julian Boardroom, located in the Administration Building of the Delaware River and Bay Authority in New Castle, Delaware.

In addition to the general Board meeting where official Authority actions take place, one or more of the following Committees may also meet to discuss matters pertaining to the DRBA: Audit and Governance Committee, Budget and Finance Committee, Economic Development Committee, Personnel Committee, and Projects Committee. The DRBA, a bi-state governmental agency created by Compact in 1962, owns and operates the Delaware Memorial Bridge, the Cape May- Lewes Ferry, and the Forts Ferry Crossing. The DRBA also manages corporate and aviation properties through its economic development powers - two airports in New Jersey (Millville Airport and Cape May Airport) and three in Delaware (New Castle Airport, Civil Air Terminal and Delaware Airpark).
