1. Committee Vice-Chair Decker opened the Budget & Finance Committee meeting at approximately 11:58 a.m. The Deputy Executive Director (DED) reported that the public meeting of the Budget & Finance Committee had been duly noticed in accordance with the Authority's Freedom Information Regulations, read the Statement of Notice, and called the roll.

2. Committee Vice-Chair Decker called for a motion to accept the Budget & Finance Committee Minutes from March 15, 2022. Commissioner Ratchford made a motion, Commissioner Smith, seconded, and the Committee Minutes were accepted.

3. Discussion Items:

• 2022 1st Quarter Financial Performance

The Chief Financial Officer (CFO) discussed 1st Quarter Traffic, Revenue and Expenses for 2022. The CFO noted commercial traffic at the DMB remains strong at approximately 680,000 transactions and noted the rebound in passenger vehicles 2.6 million transactions. Total traffic at the DMB of approximately 3.68 million compares to pre-pandemic traffic (2019) of 3.8 million transactions. The CFO noted the CMLF of 88,000 total transactions is in-line with pre-pandemic numbers. Overall, revenues for the quarter were \$2.5 million dollars better than last year and about \$2 million dollars better than projected. Concerning expenses, the only area tracking at elevated levels are fuel expenses at the CMLF remain very high for the 1st Quarter.

- 2. Committee Chair Ransome called for a motion to accept the Projects Committee Minutes from March 15, 2022. Vice-Chair Ratchford made a motion, Commissioner Faust seconded, and the Committee Minutes were accepted.

- **RESOLUTION 22-16** Authorizing an Agreement Between the Delaware River and Bay Authority and R.E. Pierson Construction Co. to Provide Pre-Construction Services to the Authority for the Ship Collision Protection System Project at the Delaware Memorial Bridge

After discussions, Committee Chair Ransome called for a motion, Commissioner Faust made a motion, Committee Vice Chair Ratchford seconded, and the Projects Committee recommended forwarding Resolution 22- 16 to the full Board for approval. The Resolution will be presented to the full Board for consideration at the April meeting later today.

4. Bid Openings

• DMB-22-06 Interstate 295 Miscellaneous Roadway Improvements

A public bid opening was held on March 30, 2022, in which (2) bids were submitted.

The COO recommended awarding the contract, in the amount of \$1,557,763.80 to Road-Con, Inc.

Committee Chair Ransome called for a motion to accept the award, to which Vice-Chair Ratchford made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Faust and Projects Committee concurred with the recommendation to accept and authorize the action to be presented to the full Board at the April meeting later today.

MIV-21-08 Building M305 Rooftop HVAC Unit Replacement

A public bid opening was held on March 30, 2022, in which (4) bids were submitted.

The COO recommended awarding the contract, in the amount of \$392,000.00 to Gaudelli Bros, Inc.

Committee Chair Ransome called for a motion to accept the award, to which Commissioner Becker made a motion, seconded by Vice-Chair Ratchford, and Projects Committee concurred with the recommendation to accept and authorize the action to be presented to the full Board at the April meeting later today.

• CMLF-20-04 Toll Booth Roof Replacement and Signage Improvement

COO noted, only (1) bid was received at nearly \$1.9 million, double the engineer's estimate. The COO is recommending splitting it into two separate projects, the Cape May work and the Lewes work, do some contractor recruitment, and conduct two re-bids. Staff therefore recommends rejection of this bid.

Committee Chair Ransome called for a motion to reject the award, to which Commissioner Faust made a motion, seconded by Vice-Chair Ratchford, and Projects Committee concurred with the recommendation to reject the bid.

5. Contract Closeout

• CMLF-19-06 MV New Jersey Repowering

The COO recommended close-out of the contract and final payment to Caddell Dry Dock & Repair Co, Inc. with a final contract amount of \$15,636,760.15.

Committee Chair Ransome called for a motion to approve the contract closeout, to which Commissioner Becker made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Faust and the Projects Committee concurred with the recommendation and authorized the close-out action to be presented to the full board at the April meeting later today.

6. Contractor Payment Reviews:

The COO reviewed for the Committee the monthly construction contractor payment summary to be made for the work completed through March 2021 for (21) payments totaling approximately \$6 million for projects at the bridge, ferry, and airports.

7. Discussion Items

New Ferry Vessels

The COO and DFO Heath Gehrke reviewed the trip to Martha's Vineyard to review the Steamship Authority's 2 Ferry vessels: a 55 car and a 75-car passenger. The committee researching the DRBA's purchase of a new Ferry, Chair Ransome, Vice-Chair Ratchford, Gehrke, Captain Megan Palmer along with the Executive Director, Deputy Executive Director and the CFO attended the Ferry to aid in the determination.

Chairman Ransome and Vice-Chairman Ratchford shared their observations regarding the trip.

In addition, the Executive Director shared his observations regarding a recent staff trip to a vessel simulator in the Baltimore area

• Contract CS-18-01: Final One-Year Extension with Verdantas (Duffield Associates, Inc) for Authority Wide Environmental Consulting Services

The environmental General Engineering Contract does work for the DRBA such as assisting with the required stormwater and spill prevention control and cleanup reports that must filed with the environmental regulators and aiding with recycling tracking.

Verdantas work has been completely, satisfactory; therefore, the DRBA would like to exercise the final 1-year renewal option. After this last year, it will be re-solicited. The resolution that originally approved the hiring of Verdantas states that the extension options can be exercised with the approval of the Projects Committee along with the Commission Chair & Vice-Chair.

Staff requests a motion of approval by the Projects Committee and will look to the Chair and Vice-Chair to make sure there are no objections.

Committee Chair Ransome called for a motion to accept the award, to which Vice-Chair Ratchford made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Faust and Projects Committee concurred with the recommendation to accept and authorize the action.

• Construction Projects Progress

The monthly construction highlights report was previously presented via email to the Commissioners. The COO asked if there were any questions on that report. There were none. The Vice-Chair commended the Veterans Memorial Park updates under way by the DRBA maintenance and acknowledged the new additions of those lost in other wars from New Jersey and Delaware.
