Delaware River and Bay Authority Releases 2025 Committee and Board Meeting Schedule

NEW CASTLE, Del. – Today, Delaware River and Bay Authority (DRBA) officials published the Committee and Board meeting schedule for the 2025 calendar year. DRBA public meetings are tentatively set to take place on the following dates below:

With the exception of the September meeting which will be held in Lewes, Delaware, the DRBA Committee and Board meetings typically take place in the James Julian Boardroom, located in the Administration Building of the Delaware River and Bay Authority in New Castle, Delaware.

These meetings typically begin at 10:00 a.m. and the meeting agenda, including board action items, is available at <u>www.drba.net</u> the day before each meeting.

In addition to the general Board meeting where official Authority actions take place, one or more of the following Committees may also meet to discuss matters pertaining to the DRBA: Audit and Governance Committee, Budget and Finance Committee, Economic Development Committee, Personnel Committee, and Projects Committee. The DRBA, a bi-state governmental agency created by Compact in 1962, owns and operates the Delaware Memorial Bridge, the Cape May- Lewes Ferry, and the Forts Ferry Crossing. The DRBA also manages corporate and aviation properties through its economic development powers - two airports in New Jersey (Millville Airport and Cape May Airport) and three in Delaware (New Castle Airport, Civil Air Terminal and Delaware Airpark).
